A little entertainment! The Times has an article every day detailing an entry from the issue exactly 100 years ago that day and this one caught my eye. I actually got to drive my own MG briefly on Sunday, but I think Tom would rather I was one of those who prefer to be a passenger, and I really must go shopping for an attractive coat suitable for motoring!

From The Times, October 19, 1924

The Motor Show at Olympia is having its effect on the windows of the West End, which all abound in appeals to the woman owner-driver or to the more numerous class who prefer the pleasures of being a passenger.

Bradleys, Chepstow Place, are making a feature this week of many attractive coats suitable for motoring. They are finding that the demand for fur-lined coats has increased in the most extraordinary way, and their large workrooms have been kept busy in carrying out increasing orders for these in various fabrics and furs. They are showing well-tailored plain tweeds, mixed cheviots, wool velour, and other suitable fabrics lined with musquash flank, natural brown musquash, and other furs. Fur coats in hard-wearing natural musquash, nutria, and equally lasting furs are also being chosen by women who like a fur coat for motoring. A novelty in motor rugs is an all-wool reversible shawl on which natural opossum is mounted. Motor cushions to match rugs and foot muffs are also available in considerable variety.

The Army and Navy Stores, Victoria Street, have many accessories suited to the motorist. There is a close-fitting toque specially designed for this purpose in douraleur finished with a gilt bow in front and with a lace veil to match fixed to the crown. It is available in golden brown or mole. Motor coats of many kinds are shown, and there is a practical straight coat in natural musquash light in weight and durable at £30 10s. In chrome leather, dark tan shade, there is a useful motor coat lined wool cheek at £6 19s 6d, and a leather cap in a becoming shape costs 20s. Tan Cape motoring gauntlets with strap fasteners are 12s. 6d a pair, and there are attractive artificial silk motor scarves in two-tone fancy stripes that are cosy wear at 12s each.

Modern day tastes would quite rightly be horrified at all that fur, and all this would have been way beyond the means of my family, Dad was born only 6 months before this article appeared but didn't own his first car until not long before I was born in the 50s!

2024 MG EUROPEAN EVENT OF THE YEAR by Chris and Shirley Pecover



At the end of July, Shirley and I set off in our MGB V8 Roadster for what we hoped would be an enjoyable trip to Luxembourg to join with a lot of other MG enthusiasts on a special gathering. The event was the "European Event of the Year 2024" held over the 1-4 August in Luxembourg. It was organised by the MG Car Club of Luxembourg, and they made an excellent job of the whole event. With approximately 250 MGs of all types and ages the entry list and full car park, it was an MG enthusiasts dream.

We caught a ferry from Dover the day before the event started and chose a hotel in the southern Champagne region to stay overnight, leaving a pleasant 3-hour drive over lovely non motorway roads to reach our destination just outside the city of Luxembourg. The hotel (Parc Hotel Alvisse) was very large with 360+ rooms, and sufficient car parking space for everyone. The organisers had arranged for overnight security to guard the larger car park which was well received by many of the attendees. A slick checking in process provided us with all the information, vouchers, etc. that we needed for the whole weekend and revealed the capable organising team at their best.

There was plenty of time in the bar to see and chat to some familiar faces as well as getting to know some folk we'd not previously encountered, before the evening buffet meal. As some 500 people were sitting down to eat, it quickly became obvious that the hotel management/staff were more than capable of delivering an excellent meal to all.

The following day saw us all heading off to the local Mondercange Karting Track for a day that optionally offered some karting, a Concours d'etat, a Peoples favourite, Gymkhana, Regularity run, and even a "Rocker Box" race. Lunch was included and served under marquees and the weather was kind enough to let us "do lunch" in pleasant sunshine. A lovely drive back through some beautiful countryside saw us arrive in good time to hunt out a beer or three before dinner. We had never been to Luxembourg before and were beginning to appreciate that whilst the country is quite small, the scenery and roads are very attractive to drive.

The Saturday activity was a choice of runs, either a Short MMM run at 140km or a regular run of 230 km, with a common lunch time halt. Again, the route directions and information provided were very well organised and they managed to ingeniously get 250 cars all parked in the small village (Berdorf) for lunch by utilising every available space. Both runs were very imaginatively planned to take us through some great countryside without leaving the country itself at all.

The gatherings in the bar before the gala dinner were many and very well lubricated, the bar was very busy and managed quite well for most of the time. The Gala dinner was very well attended, and the 3 courses were presented, buffet style at 3 different stations around the huge dining room. A good variety of choices and plenty of wine flowing helped the evening go well. As is often the case we found ourselves chatting to folk from a variety of countries, some of whom we'd met during the Friday activities, the Saturday drive or just in the bars!!





Sunday morning dawned and many people were saying their goodbyes, whilst some of us made our way out to our very wet cars in the rain to drive to a park & ride station which was the start of our tour of the City of Luxembourg itself. A free ride on the modern tram took us into the centre of the city where we rendezvoused with our respective guides, speaking in English, French, Dutch or German languages. A very informative walking tour of the immediate city centre lasted 2 hours and we learned a lot about the history of Luxembourg and its various fortifications and occupiers over the centuries. Thankfully the weather improved, and we enjoyed the afternoon in the city as we dried out!

Back to the hotel and the bar where we again met and chatted with a number of folk who were not leaving until the Monday. We left on the Monday morning to make our way to Bastogne in the Ardenne where the

famous "Battle of the Bulge" took place towards the end of the Second World War. A good 4+ hours at the museum held our attention and respect before to moving onto our hotel which was an hour and a half drive away near Rheims.

Fortunately, the weather was kind, even hot, during our last couple of days and we enjoyed a pleasant drive back to Calais to catch our ferry home without incident. Even on the dockside whilst waiting for the ferry, total strangers wanted to talk to us about the car and the event that we'd enjoyed so much.

The next MG European event of the Year, in 2025, will be based around Padua in Italy. I don't know if we'll join that one yet, because of the distances involved, but it gives us something to think about!!??
