#### Dear All

# THE 21<sup>st</sup> CORDLES' RUN Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August



On Sunday 18th August, the 21<sup>st</sup> annual **Cordles' Run** will follow a fairly short route leading you through the lanes of Surrey and Sussex ending up at the <u>Wings Museum</u> near Balcombe in Sussex.

There will be our regular fun quiz for you to complete enroute if you so wish and, on arrival, there is a large grass overflow car park where we can have our traditional picnic. There are no cafe facilities at the museum, although it is possible to get a tea or coffee so ideal for a picnic.

The Wings Museum was founded by brothers Daniel and Kevin Hunt, with the support of their father, Brian. Dan and Kevin shared a lifelong passion for warbirds, and it was their dream to establish a museum of remembrance to pay tribute to those brave servicemen and servicewomen who gave so much for our future. What started as a family interest spread rapidly as like-minded enthusiasts were attracted to the museum. The museum is now a registered charity affiliated to the RAF Association at Haywards Heath.

The unique museum is brought to life by the sounds and music of the times – visitors will be taken back to the 1940s and get a taste of life during those turbulent times - a fascinating insight into life during World War II. Every artefact and item of memorabilia tells its own unique story.

Take a step back in time and walk inside a C-47 Dakota, and experience what it would have been like as a paratrooper on D-Day, complete with sound and images.

Step inside a real Anderson Shelter and listen to the sounds of The Blitz and see an original Morrison Shelter which actually saw use during the blitz of London.

The starting point of the run this year is again at The Pheasant, Reigate Rd, Betchworth RH3 7BG. Toilets, coffee and refreshments are available at the pub. Cars will leave the pub from 10.30 am onwards (please note the pub doesn't open until 10 am)

## **SURREY RUN**

As many of you know our annual charity fundraising event took place on Sunday July 14th. Origins of the Surrey Run can be traced back over 35 years to the days of the MG "Southern National" hosted by the Epsom Area and held in the Leatherhead Leisure Centre grounds each July. This action-packed weekend dedicated Saturday to inter-Club activities including a 40-mile road run for a few cars through the picturesque Surrey countryside. In 2001 when the total weekend undertaking became financially unviable, we decided to cultivate the run as a standalone event. This has proved very popular and well supported and, over many years, has enabled us to continue our charity fundraising activities.



This year, for SURREY RUN 2024, our route was from Bocketts Farm to the Rural Life Living Museum near Farnham. With about 165 cars pre-registered, on the day

we had a good turnout despite being plagued with road closures at the A3 Cobham/M25 junction and a diesel spillage near to our start area. The actual route was not affected by these closures, but getting to and from the event did need some consideration.

As usual, we were set up and operational at Bocketts Farm ready to receive the participants by about 8.30 as the MGs started streaming in to sign on. The registration gazebos and parking marshals were kept busy until about midday when we decided that everyone taking part had arrived. Following a visit to the farm for the usual comfort break and temptation of a bacon butty, each car was photographed under the start banner before being waved off at the start of their 60-mile journey. The weather was set fair for the whole day and our planned route from Bocketts turned away from the immediate traffic issues, travelling along leafy lanes and passing through many of the picturesque villages of the Surrey countryside.



Following a journey time of about two and a half hours, and a left turn off Reeds Road, Tilford, into the Rural Life Living Museum, each car was then welcomed by our team of marshals. The cars were all parked within the museum complex providing an amazing display for all the other visitors to admire. These cars included a YB saloon, a variety of early T types, the famous Magnette, MGAs and a range of Midgets. Following into the 1970s, the MGB is still the most popular with over 74 entries. This record is followed by the modern MGFs and TFs. It is also noticeable that these ranks are being joined by the present MG examples with some cars just a few months old. On arrival, many participants immediately unpacked their picnic lunch before exploring the wide array of historic buildings containing over 40 thousand artifacts of country life from way back in the 1800s. There was certainly plenty to see, spending the afternoon relaxing and absorbing the atmosphere of a bygone age.

At the start of the run, each driver was given a prize draw ticket containing their unique run number to be handed in as they passed the finish line. When everyone had arrived, Rob Bentley, representing the Rural Life Living Museum announced the selection of winners. Three tickets were randomly chosen as follows; Galyna Bogutska, entry number 65, won first prize - a voucher for £25, Stuart Mason, entry number 3, won second prize - a voucher for £15, and Patrick O' Sullivan, entry number 93, won third prize - a voucher for £10.

This event would not be possible without the Owners' Club at HQ's continued support, and I would like to thank them and Bocketts Farm, together with the Rural Life Living Museum, for hosting the start and end venues. I would personally like to take this opportunity to also thank all those involved in the planning and implementation of this event and all of you who registered to take part. It was a full and enjoyable day with some falling asleep on the way home! From the comments and feedback that I have had so far it seems to have been a great success and I am confident that we will be able to match previous sums raised once again for this year. I am sure we all had a great day.
