SECRETARY'S SCRIBBLINGS

Dear All

By the time you read this, Epsom MGOC will be well into the 2025 calendar with both the Mothballs Run and the Annual Dinner Dance and Awards presentation in the past. February sees an Auction at Club night on the 5th and the annual Hunt the Valentine on the 16th. With the Christmas festivities behind us, Nigel Taylor has arranged both a lunchtime and evening natter for February and If you are planning to join us for the May Spring break in Jersey, and haven't yet booked, please speak to Nigel.

Looking to the year ahead, the diary is rapidly filling up. We didn't receive any volunteers from members willing to join the Committee, but please keep this in mind for the future. We will have a packed diary again this year, with a lot of shows and social events already booked and others still being finalised, all require work by the Committee, and we're not getting any younger!

There are big changes for electric vehicles being introduced in 2025 in relation to tax. From 1 April 2025, electric vehicles (EVs) will no longer be exempt from Vehicle Excise Duty as new EVs will pay £10 in the first year and £195 annually after that there is more information here. The days of free city driving for EVs are also numbered: from 25 December 2025, all vehicles, including electric and hydrogen-powered ones, must pay the £15 London Congestion Charge.

The use of cameras to detect cars exceeding the speed limit has long been accepted. A collaboration between 10 police forces and National Highways last year tested speed cameras using AI technology to detect driver offences such as no seat belts and use of mobile phones by vehicle drivers. A two-week trial with Humberside Police recorded 850 offences over the two weeks. As a result of these tests, we will be seeing a lot more of these cameras introduced across the country.

In spite of the number of protests over the 20mph speed limit throughout most of Wales, as of 2025 the goal in Scotland is to implement a nationwide 20mph speed limit on most urban and residential roads, making the primary speed limit in built-up areas 20mph by the end of the year. This is part of the Scottish Government's "National 20mph Strategy" to improve road safety.
